Opening Hours: Open 24 hours

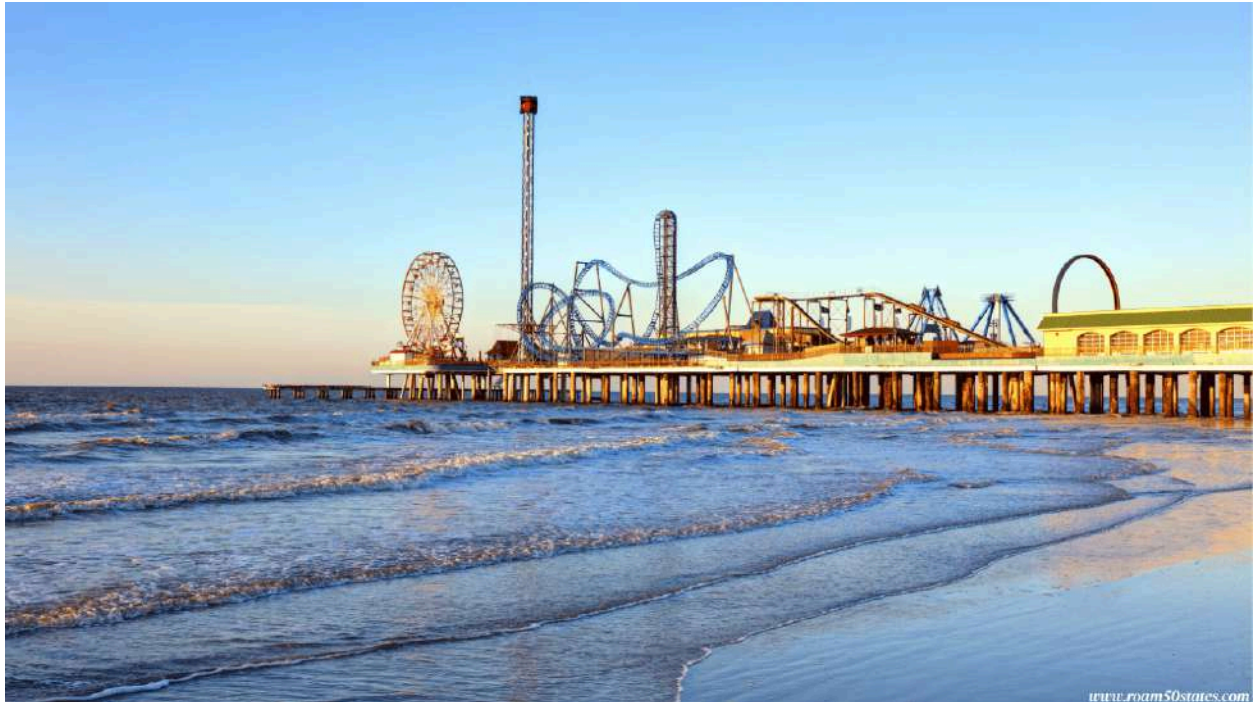
