## How to Get There



Florida is one of the easiest states to reach in the United States. It has many major airports, a strong highway network, and several cruise ports. This makes the state simple to visit whether you are flying, driving, or arriving by sea.

### **By Air**

Florida has more than twenty commercial airports. The largest ones are Orlando International Airport, Miami International Airport, Tampa International Airport, and Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport. These airports offer nonstop flights from many U.S. cities and also from international destinations. Smaller airports like Jacksonville, West Palm Beach, Sarasota, and Pensacola help travelers reach regional areas with less crowding. Flying is the fastest way to enter the state, especially if you are planning a theme park trip or a beach vacation.

### **By Car**

Florida is very road trip friendly. Interstates like I 95, I 75, and I 10 connect the state with Georgia and Alabama. These major highways make it easy to drive from the East Coast, the Southeast, or the Midwest. Road trippers can enter from the northern border and reach the center of the state within a few hours. Driving also

gives you flexibility to explore small towns, scenic beaches, and state parks along the way.

### **By Train**

Amtrak operates several routes into Florida. The Silver Meteor and Silver Star travel between New York City and Miami with stops in Jacksonville, Orlando, and Tampa. Train travel is slower but very comfortable for travelers who want a relaxed trip without driving.

### **By Cruise**

Florida is home to some of the busiest cruise ports in the world. Miami, Port Canaveral, and Fort Lauderdale serve Caribbean and Bahamas routes. Many cruise travelers extend their vacation by spending a few days in Florida before or after sailing. The ports are close to airports and major attractions, which makes planning very simple.
