

Wyoming State Fair 2026: Dates, Tickets & Douglas Travel Guide



The Wyoming State Fair 2026 returns to Douglas from August 11-15, bringing five days of rodeo action, livestock shows, agricultural exhibits, carnival rides, live entertainment, competitions, and Western traditions to the heart of Wyoming. How to Get to the Wyoming State Fair

Douglas is centrally located in Wyoming, making the fair accessible by car for travelers exploring the state.

- **By Car:** The Wyoming State Fairgrounds are located at 400 W Center Street in Douglas. The town sits along Interstate 25, making it convenient for visitors traveling between Casper and Cheyenne.
- **From Casper:** Casper is roughly an hour north of Douglas by car, making it one of the closest major Wyoming cities for travelers arriving by air or staying overnight.

- **From Cheyenne:** Travelers coming from Cheyenne can reach Douglas by following Interstate 25 north through central Wyoming.
 - **Camping at the Fairgrounds:** Camping is available during fair week. The official fair FAQ lists 2026 fairtime camping at \$40 per night for RV sites and \$20 per night for tent sites. Accessible RV sites are also available for guests with valid disability placards.
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What to Expect at the Wyoming State Fair

The Wyoming State Fair combines agriculture and Western traditions with carnival entertainment, rodeo events, competitions, and family activities. The 2026 schedule gives visitors several ways to experience the fair beyond the midway.

Ranch Rodeo

The Ranch Rodeo opens the 2026 Ford Grandstand schedule on August 11. Wyoming ranch cowboys and cowgirls compete in traditional ranch events, giving visitors an authentic look at the state's Western culture. The pre-show begins at 6:30 PM, followed by the rodeo at 7 PM. Admission is \$10, with children under 12 admitted free.

Breakaway Roping

Breakaway roping brings fast-paced Western competition to the grandstand arena. The event is part of the fair's rodeo programming and showcases horsemanship and roping skills.

Demolition Derby

The fair closes its Ford Grandstand schedule with a demolition derby on August 15. The event features high-speed vehicle action and is produced by the Douglas Volunteer Fire Department.

Livestock Shows and Agricultural Exhibits

Agriculture is at the center of the Wyoming State Fair. Visitors can see livestock competitions and exhibits representing Wyoming's ranching and farming traditions.

The fair's exhibitor program includes more than 1,000 classes covering livestock, baking, painting, gardening, quilting, upcycling, and other competitive categories.

Carnival Rides

The carnival provides classic midway entertainment for families, children, and thrill-seekers. Visitors can purchase individual ride credits or daily and multi-day wristbands depending on their plans.

Fair Food and Vendors

Food vendors offer classic fair favorites, snacks, desserts, drinks, and other foods throughout the fairgrounds. Commercial vendors also provide shopping opportunities and local products.

Western Lifestyle and Wyoming Traditions

The fair's strongest identity comes from its connection to Wyoming's ranching and Western culture. Rodeo events, livestock competitions, agricultural exhibits, and youth programs give visitors a deeper understanding of the traditions that shape the state.

Wyoming State Fair Tickets and Admission

Understanding the different admission and ride options can help you choose the best ticket for your visit.

General Fair Admission

General admission is \$10 for visitors ages 12 and older, \$5 for children ages 3-12, and free for children 3 and under. A \$25 season admission pin is also available.

Carnival Wristbands

The fair offers carnival wristbands for visitors who plan to enjoy multiple rides. The 2026 presale daily wristband is listed at \$30 plus a \$2 fee, while the regular daily wristband is \$40 plus a \$2 fee. A limited Megapass covering all five days is available for \$125 during the presale.

Grandstand Events

Some major grandstand events require separate admission. Ticket information is available online through the Wyoming State Fair before the fair and at most ticket booths during fair week.

Best Time to Visit the Wyoming State Fair

The best time to attend depends on whether you prioritize smaller crowds, cooler temperatures, carnival rides, or major entertainment.

Weekday Visits

Tuesday through Friday can be a good choice for visitors who want more time to explore the exhibits and fairgrounds without the busiest weekend crowds.

Evening Visits

Evenings are ideal for visitors interested in rodeo events, carnival rides, and entertainment. The fairgrounds take on a different atmosphere as temperatures cool and the midway lights come on.

Saturday for the Full Fair Experience

Saturday is a strong choice if you want to experience several major attractions in one day. The Wyoming State Fair Parade begins at 10 AM on Saturday, August 15, 2026.

Special Admission Days at the Wyoming State Fair

The 2026 fair includes several themed days with special admission offers and promotions.

Exhibitor Appreciation Day

On Tuesday, August 11, visitors wearing a cowboy hat receive \$1 off regular fair admission.

Youth Day

Wednesday, August 12, features special youth programming, with children 11 and younger receiving free fair admission.

Military Appreciation Day

Active-duty military personnel and veterans receive free fair admission on Thursday, August 13, with valid military identification.

Pioneer Day

Visitors ages 62 and older receive free admission on Thursday, August 13, with valid photo identification.

Foodie Friday

On Friday, August 14, visitors can receive \$5 off fair admission before 1 PM as part of Foodie Friday.

Explore Downtown Douglas
